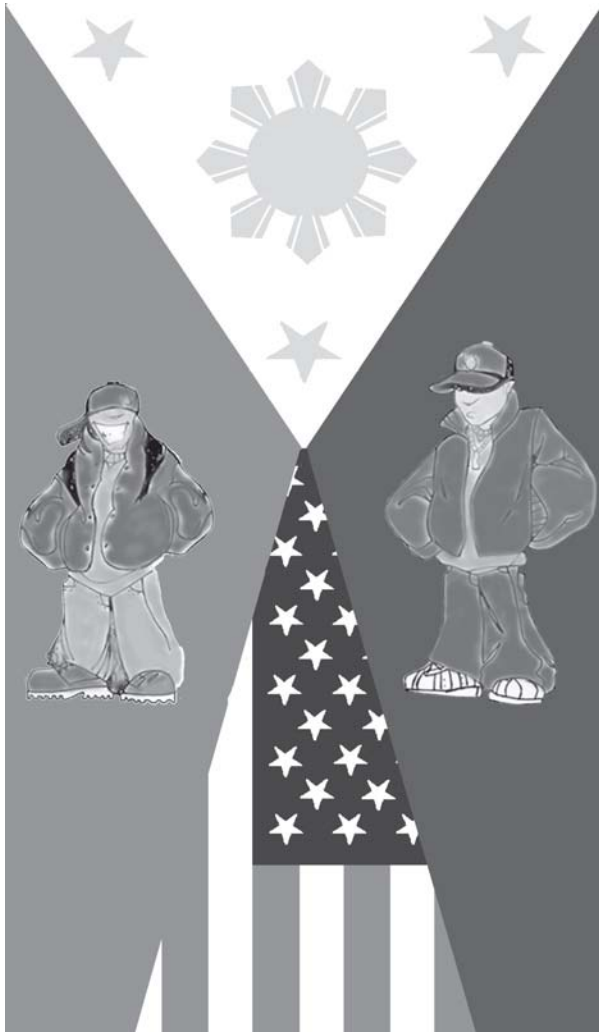

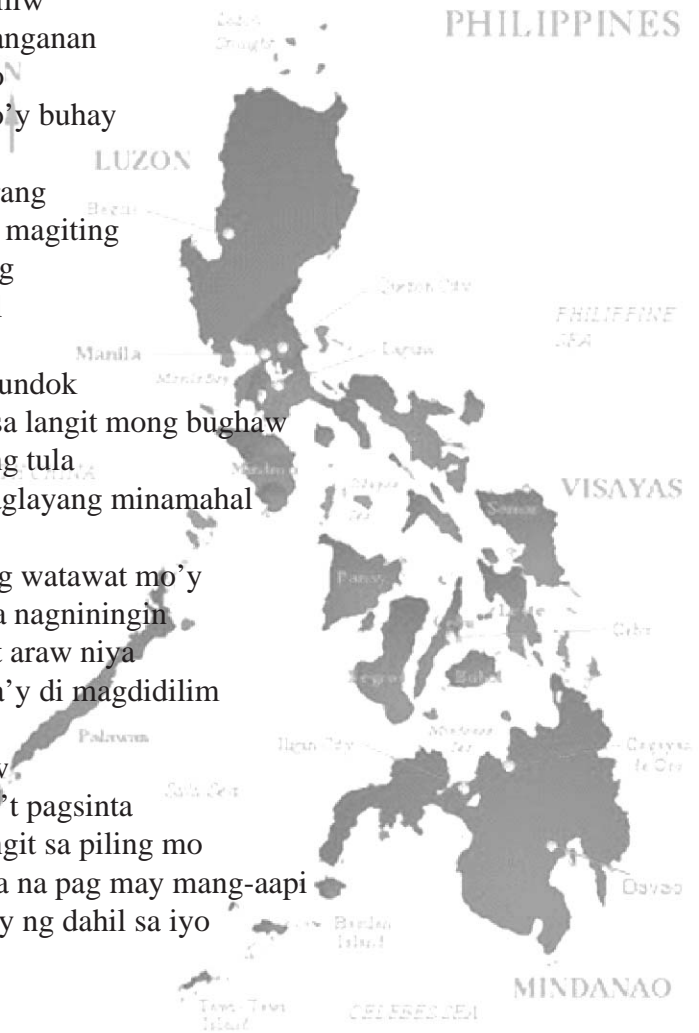
Bayang magiliw




